

Botanical Workshop by Cassandra Hodgins

On Sunday 5 June the Intro to Botanical Illustration workshop was held at the Open Door Gallery in Lowood as part of the Somerset Celebrates Art month.

In a short 3 hours participants got to experience a small taste of the precision and accuracy required to draw in the traditional style of Botanical Art.

We started with basic leaf drawing, then moved on to a simple flower and a gum nut, adding tone at the end to create form.



Everyone did wonderful work, a great way to spend an afternoon.

Photography Workshops 2022

I hope you all enjoyed reading the last two articles on lenses. I am now in the process of setting up a few photography workshops. I am always open to suggestions or topics to cover, so if anyone would like to learn about anything specific, let me know and I'll try and organise something.

Understanding Flash

Using flash on cameras can put fear into most photographers, mainly from previous experiences of the dreaded red-eye, blown out highlights and many other things! However, by understanding a few basic things about them they can be a very useful tool in creating great portraits. The workshop will look into the use of speedlights, the small flash units for cameras. It will cover topics such as when and when not to use flash, balancing flash and daylight, fill flash, bounce flash, off camera flash and the use of some light modifiers.

Digital workflows

A workshop on what to do once you have taken photographs. This session will cover importing photo files into a computer, where to put you photos on the computer and backing up images. The workshop will include a look at Adobe Lightroom Classic software and how it can be used to manage photos on your computer.

This workshop is limited to 3 participants.

Beginners Guide to Printing Photos

Printing photos should be the aim of every photographer. There are all sorts of printers out there from cheap machines that produce letters and scan documents to high end professional dedicated photo printers costing thousands of dollars. This workshop is designed for those who want to produce prints that replicate as close as possible what is seen on the computer screen. It will include monitor calibration, what ICC profiles are and why they are important, the diversity of photographic papers and how to select them for your particular photograph, soft proofing and more. Participants will have the opportunity to print one of their own images. To cover the cost of consumables, this workshop will require a fee of \$10 per participant.

This workshop is limited to 3 participants.

THE APPLE AND THE KNIFE | MERTON CHAMBERS

The Apple and the Knife brings together work by award winning artist Merton Chambers produced over the past 40 years. This late career survey exhibition focusses on recent oil pastel works by the Canadian-born, Toogoolawah based artist, which showcase his unique graphic style and vivid use of colour, a response to the luminosity of the light of his adopted home and the environmental concerns that have guided his approach to art over the past four decades.

Merton's work is held in major collections including the Government of Canada, the Art Institute of Ontario, the Ontario Board of Education, Canadian Museum for Contemporary Fine Crafts and Queensland Art Gallery | Gallery of Modern Art as well as numerous private and corporate collections.

Merton Chambers was founding director of Noosa Regional Gallery, moving later to the Somerset region in 2003.

DE-COMPOSE | DONNA DAVIS

DE-compose is a single channel video work that explores some of the hidden ecological players, such as termites, microbes and fungi, that perform an intrinsic role in the health of our planet.

The work was created using microscopic imagery of twelve termite genus from the 'Wood, Termite, Fungi Project', together with imagined microbe imagery projected over flora to create a vibrant and beautiful kaleidoscope of decay.
