

These Stories Will Be Different

20 September 2025 - 30 November 2025

Zanny Begg is an Australian artist and filmmaker interested in contested histories. These Stories Will Be Different brings together three of the artist's most significant video installations, including The City of Ladies (with Elise McLeod) 2017, The Beehive 2018, and Stories of Kannagi 2019. Between them, these works reimagine a medieval feminist utopia, probe the unsolved murder of a high-profile anti-gentrification campaigner and explore the connections between love, loss, and language in diasporic communities.

Begg's videos tell stories, but they also challenge the politics of storytelling itself. Drawing on ancient literary traditions, non-linear timeframes, and computer-generated randomisation, Begg invites you to see the world differently: "All my work has been about ways of living and inhabiting the world ... how we can live in the world differently. I am not sure if art alone can create a different world – but it can help us see how one could come into existence and the ways in which we can contribute to this process."

HOLEMTAET HEMIA (HOLD THIS/ HOLD THIS TIGHTLY)

20 September 2025 - 30 November 2025

In holemtaet hemia (hold this/hold this tightly) artist Shari O'Dwyer engages visually with her South Sea Islander heritage. Focussing on her mother's distinct childhood memories of her father's work on Queensland sugar cane fields, O'Dwyer uses humour through documented performance to demonstrate curiosity and explore identity.

holemtaet hemia (hold this/ hold this tightly) considers Shari O'Dwyer's forgotten family history, reinserting their narratives into The Condensery's bomb shelter, a place where important archival documents pertaining to Nestle's business operations (including procurement of sugar) were held during the 1940s. Through this exhibition O'Dwyer highlights the important contributions made by her family to the Queensland sugar cane industry.





The Photographic Greats - Part 2

As an avid street photographer it was a natural for me to follow a number of well know photographers from around the world such as Joel Meyerowitz, Dorothea Lange, Jill Freedman, Elliot Erwitt, and of course Henri Cartier-Bresson. However, there is one person whose work is simply incredible and only came to the attention of the world after her death.

Vivian Maier (February 1, 1926 - April 21, 2009)

Maier was an American street photographer who never published any work, never had an exhibition nor, as it seems, sought any attention. Immigrating from France in 1951 at 25, Maier work in a sweatshop for a number of years before moving to Chicago, working as a nanny for the next 40 years. She photographed people and architecture in Chicago, Los Angeles and New York and to a lesser extent, internationally.

Her "discovery" is an interesting story. In 2007, Maier was not able to keep up payments on a storage space in Chicago and decided to auction off part of her collection. Three collectors bought her work - John Maloof, Ron Slattery and Randy Prow. Maloof bought the larger part, around 30,000 negatives, for a book he was writing at the time. When he started printing some of her negatives he realised he had stumbled onto an incredible collection of documentary images of life on the streets - rich people, poor people, slums, quirkiness and so on. Maiers images were first published on the internet by Slattery in July 2008, but received little attention. However in October 2009, Maloof put some of her work on his Flickr account and the response was overwhelming.

Maloof went on to purchase most of her images from other collectors and now holds about 90% of her total work, comprising an astonishing 150,000 negatives, over 3,000 vintage prints, home movies, hundreds of rolls of undeveloped film and, surprisingly, tape recorded interviews! Since her work was discovered, Maiers images have received international attention and have appeared in gallery exhibitions, books and documentary films.

But all was not settled as a number of legal challenges followed over the years with rightful ownership contested with distant relatives in France and an art collector in America. As of 2018, her rightful heirs had still not been determined by the courts although Maloof has been allowed to continue managing her collection and promote her work under the banner of the Maloof Foundation.

To follow her story, the film Finding Vivian Maier is certainly worth watching.

Maier had a number of cameras over the years but mainly used medium format Rolleiflex cameras, buying her first in 1952. These twin lens reflex film cameras produced a negative 2 1/4 inches square allowing a tremendous amount of detail to be recorded. They also allowed her to get in close with her street portraits because to focus you have to look down onto the camera glass screen avoiding eye contact with the subject, often unaware their photo was being taken. Her best known work was done in the 1950's and 1960's with these cameras. She later used Leicas, Zeiss Contarex and other SLR cameras. By the late 1970's she stopped using Rolleiflex and started using 35mm transparency film through the 80's and 90's.

Vivian Maiers photographs are an incredible collection of photographs of life on the streets in the post-war years and capture a unique snapshot of society, taken with, as Joel Meyerowitz put it, human understanding, warmth and playfulness.

Do yourself a favour and search some of her images, it'll be worth it!
