These concertina books (by Somerset artists) will be presented at the same time as Deb Mostert's sketchbooks. Many artists attended Deb's workshops using sketchbooks and was enjoyed by all.

Showing our artist books is a great opportunity to showcase Somerset talent. Last week I had a play with my lithographic process, and here is the result. 

SOMERSET SKETCHBOOKS WITH DEB MOSTERT

'ĀM / AMMĀ / MĀ MARAM' & 'PILGRIMAGE' 24 FEB - 28 APR

In ām / ammā / mā maram, Sancintya Mohini Simpson makes visible the histories of indentured Indian women that remain marginal or erased in colonial archives. A first-generation Australian and descendant of labourers sent from the port of Madras (now Chennai), India, to work on sugar plantations in the British colony of Natal (now KwaZulu-Natal), South Africa between 1863 and 1911, Simpson's exhibition traces her family's journey through the use of materials common to these places and histories – such as sugarcane and mango.

Located in The Condensery's Bomb Shelter, Pilgrimage: Remote Animism & Ornamental Displacements forms part of a continuing series from the collaborative practice of husband and wife artists, Miguel Aquilizan & Jessica Dorizac. In their life and work they navigate through culture, colonization, history, geography, folklore and faith as contemporary Australian Filipinos. In the Pilgrimage series, they explore the interconnected themes of identity, globalisation, culture, colonization and resistance through a playful sculptural installation. This iteration is a new body of work produced in Australia, since Miguel Aquilizan & Jessica Dorizac have returned from practicing in the Philippines.

The Fernvale Artists have had a most enjoyable month, preparing for their coming exhibition at the Glen Rock Gallery, being guests at the Lowood Open Door Gallery at a thank you morning tea for volunteers, and most of all on an excursion to the Phil Whatmore Gallery at Skydive Ramblers at Toogoolawah. This wonderful gallery, a collection of around four hundred paintings by a champion parachutist, Phil Whatmore, is open by appointment

An artist all his life, Phil began to paint in earnest after a sky diving accident at the age of thirty-one left him unable to walk. From landscapes to seascapes, from portraits to townscapes, from religion to animals; from realism to impressionism to abstract, the range and size of the collection is amazing.



We sincerely thank Dave McEvoy, curator of the exhibition, who gave us an excellent guided tour, and urge all art groups in our area to arrange a visit for their members. An uplifting experience.

This very enjoyable morning was followed a couple of days later by the official opening of the new murals on the back of the Fernvale Visitor Information Centre.

Commissioned by the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail Users Association, the murals were painted by Somerset artist Susan McConnell. The Fernvale Artists had a stall on the day and held an art workshop, enjoyed by one adult and half a dozen children. Our thanks to all those who helped us on the day. And yes, Sue has a Blue Card.

Sue also reminded everyone that the original Fernvale Murals, in the same park, were created by the Fernvale Artists following the 2011 flood.

Slumps and how to avoid them

Every been in a motivational slump? Just don't seem inspired anymore? Not having taken a decent photo for ages? Well, you're not alone! My personal "journey" (ugh...everybody seems to be using this word!) over the last couple of months has been all but inspired.

I wonder if we are placing too high an expectation on ourselves with having to produce outstanding work, living for the expectations of others and not ourselves? I think sometimes this is a trap people can so easily fall into and that in some regards leads us to think that we failed ourselves for not creating that next amazing image, the show stopper, the award winner with every click of the button. Truth is that these amazing images that we so eagerly chase can be elusive and that's just part of the game. Ansel Adams once said that if he produced just 10 images a year he was happy with, then that was a great year!

There are many things, including life events, that can lead to a situation where we can sometimes feel that its an insurmountable effort to get those creative juices flowing again (there are only so many YouTube videos you can watch!). But maybe we've immersed ourselves so much in our pursuits that we have become too focused and we miss out on the bigger picture - you know, the "I can't see the forest for the trees" thing. I've been down that road and I eventually run into a wall and get frustrated because the images I am creating are not what my expectations are, well... expecting. Over-editing is another pitfall where I get so carried away that I start to lose sight of the initial pre-visualisation I had when pressing the shutter button. Leaving that edited image for a few days and then coming back to it often, for me anyway, leaves me wondering what the blazes I was doing - it's too contrasty, too saturated, too this or too that. And I hit the reset button and start again. This by-the-way is a technique I do a lot of now, leaving an image for a while and come back it with fresh eyes.

Maybe that's what we all need to do sometimes - to hit our own personal re-set button, put the camera down and go walk barefoot somewhere - you know - to lose those built up electrons or whatever and "earth" ourselves. Take a walk, take a road trip, go camping, go somewhere... and yeah, don't listen to me - just take the camera!

And lets not forget that Social Media can be partly to blame here as I think it's all to easy to fall into the "chasing likes" mentality and we feel that our creations are just not good enough and start to wonder what we've done wrong when we don't receive the sought after thumbs up we think we should be getting. Personally I can't be bothered trying to keep up with the never ending changes Instagram does to manage an audience.

All this seems rather negative but there is a point to my ramblings and that is to do the stuff you love for you, and not someone else. That's where the happy-ness comes from. And if someone else likes your creations, then that's a bonus. I would have given the wonderful art of photography away ages ago if I didn't think like that.


